(1) Financial Update

Committed giving received \$109,746
Anticipated giving \$107,400

(2) Organ Upgrade

The organ builder has advised that work on the organ cleaning and upgrade is 75% complete. Progress is on target and the work is expected to be completed in the next 3 to 4 weeks.

The repairs to the footpaths through the cemetery have been completed as per the quotation received. As indicated at the AGM the funds for this work will be taken from the Cemetery Board's funds held by the General Trust Board and designated as Cemetery Funds.
