A House Candlelight Concert

"Vivente" a new baroque music group.

1 Monument Rd Clevedon Friday 26 April 6.45pm. "To My Illustrious Father" is a programme of music and readings that takes us behind the walls of a Tuscan convent during a time of great scientific and musical innovations, in which women ruled the Republic of Florence and wrote opera. In a nun's cell the daughter of Galileo wrote impassioned letters of support to her father in his Papal prison, and in the private rooms of the Medici palace the quick-witted Francesca Caccini wrote and performed songs that were admired across Italy.

A trio of **lute, viol and soprano voice** will bring to life the music of Caccini and her contemporaries in seventeenth-century Italy, and the performers will present readings that draw together the nun and the composer.

Rowena Simpson, Polly Sussex and Jonathan le Cocq are Vivente the new baroque music trio of Aotearoa. Its combination of voice, lutes and viols is rarely heard here and its three members are all acclaimed performers of early music.
