Duo Vivo Violin and Piano/Piano accordion

Miranda Adams (violin) is a regular visitor to Thursdays @ Seven as leader of the Jade String Quartet. Tonight she is joined by talented pianist and accordionist Tatiana Lanchtchikova (piano and piano accordion) in a wonderfully varied programme travelling from Mozart, through Brahms and Kreisler, to Tango composer Piazzolla.



5. Francis/Ree Duo

Successful chamber musicians in New Zealand and overseas, Charlotte Francis (violin) and Gemma Lee (piano) present a recital of sonatas by Beethoven and Sarasate's Spanish Dances. Having previously enjoyed working with each other in the University of Auckland as administrative staff, in 2016 the two decided to collaborate musically with long-term professional intentions. Both also have extensive teaching practices.



6. Donald Kicholls and Marie Ross - clarinets, Kent Ssomura piano

Donald has been a frequent visitor to our concerts, always bringing fascinating programmes. This time works for two clarinets by Mendelssohn bookend the recital. Together with those great pieces, the artists include works for solo clarinet and piano by Schumann, Messager, Spohr and Debussy.
